- We will use the following guidelines in determining whether students go outside or stay inside during winter weather for recess: Please have children wear coats to school!

 - 2. If the temperature is between 25 and 31 degrees, wind chill will be considered before a decision is made to go out or to stay inside.
 - 3. If the temperature is below 25 degrees, students will remain inside.


4th Grade Holiday Greetings

November was a very busy month! I don't know where the time is going. Before you know it, Christmas will be here and then the New Year. Don't forget to encourage your fourth grader to keep reading for Book It and AR. The holidays will be a wonderful time to catch up on a great book or two. Please remember that they have to read a second book this quarter by December 20th and pass the AR test with a 70% or higher. The grade they get on the test is the grade that goes in the gradebook. If this test is not passed or they don't read their second book, it will be graded as 0%. In math we are continuing to multiply and will soon be dividing. In chapter 5 we are multiplying with two-digit numbers and in chapter 6 we will be dividing by a one-digit number. Please practice the basic multiplication facts so they can focus on the concept of multiplying/dividing greater numbers and not trying to figure basic facts. This will help alleviate any additional frustrations during these chapters. A great time for reviewing facts would be in the car or while waiting in those long check out lines. ©

In math, we just completed a chapter on adding and subtracting decimal numbers. It isn't an easy skill, and this is the perfect time of the year to have your student practice adding money. They can make a Christmas list and add up how much it costs. It's a great way to practice adding decimals or subtracting them.

We are in the middle of Unit 2 of our reading series. The unit concept is doing the right thing so we've been reading stories about people who have the courage to do the right things. After we finish the unit, we will be doing ten days of Christmas study. Each day we will study the history of different Christmas symbols and traditions.

We just finished a chapter on Growth and Survival in Science. We studied how plants and animals adapt to their environments and what happens when their environment changes. We are growing our own bean plants using a hydroponic garden. We will be replanting those the first week of December.

In Social Studies, we are finishing a chapter on explorers. We will be choosing an explorer and writing a report on his/ her life.

Our Christmas party will be Thursday, December 19^{th,} at 2 p.m. I will send out a parent reminder the first week in December if you have volunteered to help us celebrate; as well as a note explaining our class Christmas exchange. We also have a Santa Shop coming up in December. This is a great way to support our LOOP and finish that Christmas shopping. Check the calendar for the band concert and music concert. It is definitely going to be a busy December!

I hope everyone had a wonderful Thanksgiving with family and friends! It's hard to believe that Christmas will be here in just a few weeks! We have been learning a lot and the students are doing a great job! In Reading, we have been talking about Unforgettable Personalities. Some of the characters in our stories have been human, such as parents or sisters or brothers. We have learned that animals can be characters that possess unforgettable personalities that impact many of us in amazing ways, too! We have also been making inferences using our prior knowledge and information from the text in order to become more effective readers! In Geography, we completed a review of the 50 states and capitals! Everyone matched the states and capitals and labeled them on a blank map. This took a lot of effort and memorization. Great job, 6th graders! In Science, we have been learning about different kinds of erosion and deposition.

In 7th grade Social Studies, we are learning about the original thirteen colonies. In our next chapter, we will be learning about events leading up to the American Revolution. We will also be talking about significant battles fought during the war and how each one led to the colonists winning the American Revolution. We will be ending this unit with an informational video on America: The Story of Us from the History Channel.

In 8th grade Social Studies, we have been talking about Pacific expansion and the United States becoming a world power. In our next chapter, we will begin our discussion about World War I. We will be learning about the United States position of neutrality and what events eventually forced America to enter the war. Throughout our discussions about the 1920's, we will be talking about various changes in the White House, as well as changes in life that still influence us today.

Season s Greetings from Miss Zielske

I can't believe November is almost over! I hope everyone enjoys their Thanksgiving break.

In English, all students have been improving their ability to punctuate complex sentences correctly and use a variety of different sentence lengths in their writing. Seventh and eighth grade even learned how to write a compound-complex sentence. Sixth graders started their Genius Hour projects, which involve researching a topic of their choice. They will typically work on these projects once a week in class. Each grade is starting to work on their argument writing units. Students learn how to develop claims, evidence, and explanation of the evidence without using feelings or emotions toward the subject. Seventh and eighth graders will dive a little deeper and learn about counterarguments and rebuttal. We will be doing several class activities that focus on different types of argument writing that include having to read articles and gathering information before a claim can be made.

Students in seventh and eighth grade are continuing to use different reading strategies in their stories. In December, seventh grade will be reading a play called "Brian's Song" and comparing it to the movie version. Eighth grade will be taking a break from their reading textbooks to do a novel study of *A Christmas Carol* by Charles Dickens. They enjoyed their mini-research project on Victorian England topics to help give us background on the novel. I have also challenged eighth graders to read an additional classic novel on their own for an opportunity to earn extra credit. The next AR book is due by December 20th.

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year from Mrs. Heap

Wow! I can't believe that it's December and the holidays are just around the corner. We have accomplished so much already, but of course, we have so much more to cover before the end of the year. Math classes are working on a variety of topics. Sixth grade is beginning a geometry unit and will continue in the math curriculum by working with ratios and percentages. The seventh grade class is working with percentage problems and will progress to solving inequalities. Eighth grade is graphing linear equations and will round out January by solving inequalities. Additional math practice on IXL.com is available to students anywhere there is an internet connection. If you are having trouble logging in at home, please contact me and I will help you get connected.

Science classes have started new units. Seventh grade students are beginning a unit on cells and heredity. At the end of November, students showcased their models of cells by inviting the school to come and view their Cello-O Jell-O projects and amazed everyone with how they transformed my room into a giant model of a cell. In December, they will focus their attention on studying heredity. Eighth grade is starting the chemistry unit. Each day we will highlight a different element and learn about its special characteristics. We will also begin building small models, starting with atoms, and continue until we can model large molecules and compounds.

The junior high will host the area senior citizens for lunch and entertainment on Friday, December 6th. This is a wonderful opportunity for our students to relax and talk to community members that they may not otherwise have the opportunity to get to meet. This activity is paid for by money from the junior high activity fees. <u>All students should dress in speech contest attire</u>... no gym shoes, blue jean, or t-shirts will be allowed.

Our Christmas party is scheduled for Friday, December 20th, which includes a movie, snacks, and a gift exchange (spend about \$10). The movie takes place in the morning with a break for treats around 10 AM. A reminder notice will go out about a week prior to the party for the parents who signed up to send in treats.

Our first community service project in the junior high will be collecting donations for a local charity. The "Mitten Tree" will be located by the office door.
