Kindergarten Registration:

Kindergarten registration for the 2021-2022 school year will be held at the school on Wednesday, August 4th from 12:00 – 1:00 P.M. During registration, the incoming kindergarten students are invited to visit the kindergarten classroom.



While the children are in class, parents will go to the library to register the students for the fall session. If not completed already, registration and enrollment forms need to be completed. Information needed to complete these cards include: names and telephone numbers of the child's doctor and dentist, phone numbers where the child's parents can be reached during the day and a relative or neighbor whom the school should contact if unable to reach the parents.

To be eligible to attend kindergarten during the 2021-2022 school year: A child must be five years old on or before September 1, 2021 and A certified copy of the child's birth certificate must be presented at the time of registration. Parents will also need to bring with them two forms of residency identification that includes their name and physical address. Examples: A property tax bill, rental agreement, voter registration card, utility bill, credit card bill, etc. Junk mail does not qualify.

Parents will also receive physical, dental, and vision examination forms. Kindergarten students <u>will</u> not be allowed to begin school in August unless these forms have been completed and returned to the school.

School fees will be paid during the regular school registration days on either August 4th or 5th. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to call the school at (815)736-6324.

Sports Physicals:

Newark Healthcare Center is graciously doing sports physicals again for Lisbon Grade School on Monday, April 19, 2021 at 12 PM. The fee for these physicals will be \$20 cash or check made payable to **Morris Hospital**. They are also offering an incentive and plan to "give back" to the school by offering the fees back to go towards the end of year character counts assembly. So, if your student needs a sports physical for next year, this is a great way to free up an appointment for you plus help the school

All students participating in a school sport <u>must have a sports physical</u> before they participate with the exception of 6th grade that must have a complete school physical prior to participating.

Recycle:

We want to encourage community members and parents to bring their old newspapers for the paper recycle bin on the south side of the building. This is a great way to teach our students how to recycle and be environmentally smart.



Bus Notes:

The school requires that parents always write a note to the office or teacher if a student is to go home from school by a different method than normal. Often time's children get mixed up on dates or where they are to go if a note is not sent. Our policy is to have students follow the normal routine unless they have a note or the school receives a phone call from the parents. This year we are not allowing children to ride the bus to a friend's house if they do not already ride that particular bus. We are trying to keep the passenger numbers down due to COVID.

Graduation:

8th Grade Graduation will be held on Wednesday, May 19th at 7:00 P.M. The current plan is to have the ceremony outside on the blacktop. Pictures of the 8th grade class will be taken inside. In the event of inclement weather, we will need to move graduation inside and will need to limit the number of guests per graduate. A minimum of a 24 hour notice will be given if the ceremony will be moved indoors. More information will follow.

Kendall County Agriculture in the Classroom had a food drive contest between all participating schools in the county. Food pantries generally struggle to maintain adequate supply in the summer months and this food drive is to support the needs of the community.

Community members can also participate by donating money on the fundraising platform Go Fund Me. The donations will be split between food banks to support buying from local farms.

Kendall County has 3 food pantries that together serve over 1,400 families each month. This food drive will benefit the Kendall County Community Food Pantry, Harvest Baptist Food Pantry, and Helmar Lutheran Church Pantry.

We are proud to say that Lisbon Grade School did an amazing job collecting! Kindergarten – 4^{th} grade collected **187 pieces** and 5^{th} – 8^{th} grade collected **100 pieces**. Great job for our small school!

News from Second Grade

We are ready to welcome spring in second grade! Sunshine, warmer weather, and being outside are some of the things we are looking forward to. We have been looking for signs of spring. We were pretty excited to start seeing robins out our window this past week. Please check the weather in the morning before school so you know whether you need to send your child in a coat. Weather can be so unpredictable, and we usually are outside for recess.

I am so proud of the work the students did on their cereal box book reports. They look great! I am trying to get students to challenge themselves and read harder books. Increasing vocabulary is a great benefit of reading books that are a higher level. In addition, I am trying to push the students to try different types of books. Sometimes we get in the habit of just reading a certain author or genre and need a push to branch out.

This quarter we will begin to learn the cursive capital letters. It is a very exciting time for second

graders. Please remind your child to practice the cursive letters that we have learned at home. Joining the letters to form words is especially difficult. The idea that you can't lift up your pencil when writing a word is challenging some of the students. In spelling we will be learning to write the words in print and cursive. On the tests, though, I will only grade the printed words.

We will spend the month of April learning about eggs, chickens, incubation, and embryology. Our eggs should arrive in the mail around April 6th. The class has been looking forward to it all year! It is a favorite unit of mine as well. Pretty soon everyone in the class will be "egg-sperts"!

Keep encouraging your child to read in his/her spare time. As the weather warms up it is hard to keep everyone reading! We compared our latest fluency check to the one we took previously. Some students went down in the number of words read per minute. This indicates to me that students need to be reading more and challenging themselves to read harder material. Be on the lookout for information regarding the Book-It pizza party if your child completed all six months of the program.

This week we have been reading <u>Flat Stanley</u> and writing our letters. I will mail our letters over break. When Stanley returns please send him in to share his adventures with the class.

The sixth graders just finished their poetry unit and will be wrapping up their Shurley English books after spring break. They will start research papers on ancient civilizations after IAR testing. They will be working on organizing their facts, starting sentences in a variety of ways, and learning about Works Cited pages.

The seventh graders just finished their poetry unit as well. They really showed their creativity in their free choice poetry projects! After break, they will have a quick letter writing unit. We will practice writing friendly letters, business letters of complaint, and thank you letters for strange gifts. They will be picking their topics for their medieval times research papers after that.

The eighth graders finished their World War II literature circle books and are working on their World War II research papers. They will work on the new skills of using direct quotes and parenthetical citations. Next, they will learn about letter writing, verbals, and verbal phrases. After IAR testing, the eighth graders will be starting literature circles with a variety of recent novels. Many of these novels focus on dystopian or apocalyptic societies. I am looking forward to some good discussion on what the students would do if they were the characters in the novels.
